

Neighbor Spotlight



Carl and Dot Bailey (Inverness Scotland 2018)

The Bailey's moved to West Farm in August 2015. They came in hopes of finding a smaller yard, newer house and a nice neighborhood with a variety of age groups. They both had ties to Fountain Inn although they lived in Greenville for over 47 years. Carl's grandfather lived only 2 miles from West Farm so he spent time in the area during the 1940's and 50's. Dot owned and operated an equestrian center about 5 miles from town on Garret Patton Road. Carl is a Clemson graduate with both a BS and MS degree then went on to MUSC to get a

medical degree. Dot is a nurse and they met at Greenville General Hospital. They have now been married 59 years and have 5 children and 12 grandchildren. They love family gatherings and events. Dot is also a quilter heirloom sewing instructor who donates handmade blankets and gowns to the Intensive Care Nurseries at local hospitals. She also enjoys taking their therapy dog, Maddie, to nursing homes and schools. Carl is a volunteer faculty member at a medical school and active in Scottish activities including the St. Andrews Society and has been on the band committee of The City of Greenville Pipes and Drums for 40 years. He remains active in the North American Ramsay Family Association which he founded and has become an International organization. He still finds time to enjoy fly fishing and fly tying with tiny midge flies.

Carl is also an honored veteran who served from 1955 to 1967 during the cold war. Following college, he was commissioned into the Army as a 2nd Lieutenant and joined the active reserves during graduate school and medical school serving in the Signal Company of the 108th Infantry Division. He went active duty just 4 days after the Russians started building the Berlin Wall and was assigned to the medical unit at the Chemical Warfare Center, Edgewood Arsenal Maryland. Later that year he became Commander of the unit and placed on the Commanding Generals staff. He closed the old hospital and converted it to an outpatient center over the next year. The staff duty required involvement in planning for attack, war games, and the intrigues of the cold war. The very controversial human volunteer testing of chemical agents was active at the time - he was not involved with the program. The Cold War era has been largely forgotten and most people do not know how close to war we came during the Cuban Missile Crisis. However, Carl remembers being on lockdown, armed, and ready for deployment, without even knowing what the problem was. During that time, he had several temporary assignments with various groups, the most interesting being with the Army Nuclear Defense Command. After 2 years in this assignment, Carl received commendation for service and left active duty. The next 3 years were spent in active reserve service in a MASH hospital. In 1966 he became a member on the inactive reserves.
