Overall Responsibility of the HOA Board is to make decisions that will ensure WF remains a family oriented, safe, and highly desirable community through voting, planning, collaboration with neighbors, committees and service vendors.

President: Overall management of West Farm and the West Farm Website. Produce and present association goals to Board for discussion. Establish meeting times, dates, locations, and agenda then preside over all meetings. Oversee vendor contracts and provide quality assurance of the services. Enable all members of Board to meet their respective tasks and responsibilities. Point of contact for CMG.

Vice President: Act in lieu of President if needed. Ensure the goals set for association are in line with long-term goals. Schedule food trucks and communicate schedule to neighbors. Support social media efforts.

Secretary: Maintain all records and documents of the HOA. Per governing documents, ensure required notices are sent on time. Support creation and publication of the West Farm Newsletter.
